 - 1. "Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness" (Rom 4:3).
 - a. "No unbelief made him waver concerning the promise of God" (Rom 4:20a).
 - 1) "He grew strong in his faith as he gave glory to God" (Rom 4:20b).
 - 2) "Fully convinced that God was able to do what he had promised" (Rom 4:21).
 - b. "That is why his faith was 'counted to him as righteousness'" (Rom 4:22).
 - 2. "That is why it depends on faith, in order that the promise may rest on grace and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all" (Rom 4:16).
