How Can I Prepare Myself for Worship?

- A. The children of Israel knew what it was to prepare for the worship of the LORD their God.
 - 1. They were called to prepare themselves to hear from God at Mt. Sinai (*Exo* 19:9-11).
 - 2. Perpetual preparations would be required for the hundreds of annual appointed sacrifices.
 - 3. Every time the priests would minister at the tabernacle, they were to prepare themselves.
 - 4. On multiple occasions throughout the year, Jews would prepare for a journey to Jerusalem.
 - 5. Jesus sent Peter and John to prepare the Passover meal for the apostles in *Luke 22:7-8*.
 - 6. The LORD clearly revealed how he felt about getting the meager leftovers (Mal 1:6-14).
- B. As disciples of Christ, we also are the recipients of a call to worship (John 4:24; Heb 10:19-25).
- C. Perhaps one of the most countercultural, influential things we can do in our fast-paced, successdriven society is to devote every first day of the week to rest, reflection, and worship.

Many people have prepared for this morning. How can we all prepare ourselves for worship?

1. Honestly evaluate whether or not you need to (Luke 8:4-5,12).
2. Earnestly God outside the walls of this building (<i>Matt 4:4; 6:5-6; James 5:13</i>) in order that the seed of God's word might develop deep in your heart (<i>Luke 8:6,13</i>).
3. Purpose, plan, and prepare like a, even in the mundane details of life, so that your heart isn't hectic, rushed, and unprepared (1 Cor 10:31; Col 3:23; Psa 5:3).
4. Prepare your mind by getting plenty of (1 Chron 28:9; Eccl 1:13; 1 Cor 14:15).
5. Be wary of before, during, and after worship (<i>Luke 8:7,14</i>).
6. Persistently work to cultivate an attitude of (Heb 12:28-29) and (Psa 43:3-4; 118:24; 122:1) at the prospect of worshiping God.
7: for your own heart, for your fellow-worshipers, and for the glory of God (<i>Isa 55:10-11</i>).
8. Allow plenty of to arrive and get settled (Luke 10:41-42).
9. Deliberately your thoughts and your heart (<i>Psa 19:7-11</i>).
10. Patiently (Luke 8:8, 15; 1 Cor 15:58).

Conclusion:

- A. Our God has prepared so much for us! (Psa 23:5; Mal 3:1; Heb 10:5; John 14:2-3).
- B. Are you preparing yourself to worship? What needs attention moving forward?
- C. Are you ultimately prepared to meet your Creator? (Amos 4:11-12; Acts 2:37-41)
