## The God Whose Sovereign Plan Doesn't Fit Into a Sitcom

- A. The LORD God Almighty isn't a screenwriter in Hollywood.
  - 1. Thanks to Hollywood, we've come to expect stories—even the most complex and heartbreaking of stories—to be neatly wrapped up and completely resolved in bite-sized, easily digestible portions.
  - 2. Within the span of 2 hours, 1 hour, perhaps even 30 minutes, justice is realized, mysteries are solved, problems are resolved, and all that was out of alignment is beautifully realigned.
- B. But the sovereign plan of the God we serve doesn't fit into a sitcom, and that's okay.
  - 1. His stories take years, decades, centuries, even millennia to unfold.

more time the LORD while he may be found (*Isa* 55:6-9).

- 2. He intentionally leaves certain things achingly unresolved.
- 3. Some threads of the plot seem to disappear, only to reappear at the most unexpected moments.
- C. The LORD God Almighty isn't a Hollywood screenwriter, but He *is* real. God is willing and able to change what matters most, redeem what money cannot buy, and secure what will last forever.

| Real-Life Examples:  |
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| • is 75-years-old when God calls him and makes the "great nation" promise (Gen 12:1-4). Isaac won't be born for another years (Gen 21:1-7).  |
| •, one of Abraham's great-grandson's, is sold at 17 by his brothers to Midianite traders and carried down to Egypt ( <i>Gen 37</i> ). He resists the sexual advances of his master's wife and gets thrown in prison ( <i>Gen 39</i> ). "Some time after this" ( <i>Gen 40:1</i> ), Joseph interprets the dreams of two prisoners and is forgotten ( <i>Gen 40:23</i> ) for " whole years" ( <i>Gen 41:1</i> ). |
| • "The people of Israel were fruitful and increased greatly" (Exo 1:1-7), but it had been years since God made the promise that a great nation would made of Abraham (Gen 12:2). The children of Israel were slaves in Egypt for years (Gen 15:13; Acts 7:6; Exo 2:23-24; 12:40-41).   |
| • Meanwhile, had been living as an exile in Midian for years (Acts 7:23-30).   |
| • Moses would patiently endure years' worth of wandering in the wilderness between Egypt and the Promised Land because of Israel's unbelief ( <i>Num 32:7-15</i> ).  |
| • The LORD eventually gave Israel all the land that he had sworn to give to their fathers ( <i>Josh 21:43-45</i> ), but it had been years since God had made his land promise to Abraham ( <i>Acts 7:2-5</i> ).  |
| • Time would fail to tell of and his family ( days in the ark), (Judges 6:13), (Ruth 1:20-21), (1 Sam 1:6-7), and (Dan 9:2).   |
| • Most significant of all, "The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ" spans years (Matt 1)!   |
| Vital Conclusions:   |
| 1. At pivotal moments in life, these people had no idea what God was Neither will we.  |
| 2. At many points in life, we won't understand God is allowing certain things to happen.   |
| 3. And yet, the clear testimony of Scripture is that God you and he what he's doing.   |
| 4. Therefore, we should spend less time fretting, worrying, and agonizing over things we cannot, and   |
