 - 1. Aaron's staff-turned-serpent "swallowed up" the staffs of Pharaoh's sorcerers in Exodus 7.
 - 2. Korah and his rebellious compatriots were "swallowed up" by the earth in Numbers 16.
 - 3. David affirmed that those who hate the LORD would be "swallowed up" in his wrath in Psalm 21.
 - 4. David prayed, "Let not the flood sweep over me, or the deep swallow me up" (Psa 69:15).
 - 5. Israel was said to have been "swallowed up" by Assyria in Hosea 8.
 - 6. The LORD appointed a great fish "to swallow up" Jonah in Jonah 1.
- B. To be "swallowed up" is to be consumed, enveloped, or assimilated. In most contexts it's a terrifying thought...all of which makes 2 Corinthians 4:4-5:5 incredible.
