- ◆ “*We have seen _____ things today.*” (*Luke 5:26; 7:22; 8:25; John 14:11*)

- ◆ “*He casts out demons by _____, the prince of demons.*” (*Luke 11:14-20*)
But what sense does it make for Satan to work against himself?
- ◆ “*A great _____ has arisen among us!*” (*Luke 7:16; 9:7-8*)
But has there ever been a prophet as great as this? Could he be more?
- ◆ “*Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O _____.*” (*Luke 5:8*)
To which Jesus responds, “*Why do you call me ‘Lord’ and not do what I tell you?*” (*Luke 6:46*)
- ◆ “*Blessed is the _____ who comes in the name of the Lord!*” (*Luke 19:37-40*)
If he is only the long-awaited heir of David, why does David call him Lord? (*Luke 20:41-44*)
- ◆ “*Are you the King of the _____?*” (*Luke 23:3*)
But he conquers death and says that his message is for all nations (*Luke 24:44-48*)
- ◆ “*Who can forgive sins but _____ alone?*” (*Luke 5:21; 7:49*)
The demons have known all along (*Luke 4:34, 41; 8:28*)
- ◆ “*This is my _____, my Chosen One*” (*Luke 9:35a, 20*)
