- 2. Live triumphant in Christ and embrace your heritage (1 Peter 2:11; Hebrews 11:13; Philippians 3:19-20).
 - a. Are you longing for the Lord's return? Are you ready for the Lord to come....have you been living with Heaven in view, with eternity in mind? (2 Corinthians 5:8; Philippians 1:23-24).
 - b. "Lord, keep me eternity conscious."
