2—The Beatitudes (part 2) Matthew 5:3-12; Luke 6:17-26



1. In the final Beatitude, Jesus promises those who are "persecuted for righteousness' sake" will have a "great" reward. In our last class, we focused on the character of the citizens of God's kingdom. Yet, write down the promises Jesus makes to those citizens in verses 3-12.

2. What is the first word used in Psalm 1? What is the first word John uses in Revelation 1:3? How many times is that same word used in Matthew 5:3-12? How does look phrase this level of happiness in Luke 6:23?

- 3. In Matthew 5:3, Jesus promises "the kingdom of heaven." In what sense might this be a present blessing (see Matthew 16:18; Colossians 1:13; Revelation 1:9), and a future blessing (Matthew 25:34; 2 Peter 1:10-11; 3:13)?
- 4. In Matthew 5:4, Jesus promises "those who mourn...they shall be comforted." In what sense might this be a present comfort (2 Corinthians 1:3-5), and in what sense might it be a future comfort (Revelation 21:1-4)?
- 5. In Matthew 5:5, Jesus promises "the meek…they shall inherit the earth." This phrase is a quote from Psalm 37. In what sense, might this be a present earthly blessing (see Matthew 6:33; Ecclesiastes 5:19-6:2), and in what way might this be a future promise (2 Peter 3:10-13)?

6. In Matthew 5:6, Jesus promises those who "hunger and thirst for righteousnessthey shall be filled." What is the source of God's saving "righteousness" (Romans 1:16-17; Philippians 3:8-9)? When we feel "self-righteous" how will this affect us seeking Christ?
7. In Matthew 5:7, Jesus promises "the mercifulthey shall obtain mercy." When we receive God's "mercy" what ought we be willing to do for others (cp. Romans 5:9; Matthew 18:23-35; 25:31-46)? What will a lack of mercy in our lives lead to with us (James 2:13)?
8. In Matthew 5:8, Jesus promises the "pure in heart…they shall see God." How, in a sense, was it possible for us to see God when Jesus walked the earth (John 14:6-7; Hebrews 1:1-3)? When will we "see God" in the future (Revelation 21:3; 22:3-4)?
9. In Matthew 5:9, Jesus promises the "peacemakersthey shall be called sons of God." In the context of the Sermon on the Mount, what else does Jesus say about making "peace" (5:23-25; 5:43-44)? What are some things we can do to encourage others to make peace with all men (Romans 12:18; Hebrews 12:14; James 3:18)?
10. In Matthew 5:10-12, Jesus promises those persecuted "for righteousness' sakegreat is your reward in heaven." How encouraging is it to know that a life of faithfulness may lead to earthly poverty, but can end in unimaginable wealth (Matthew 19:21, 28-30; Acts 5:41; Romans 8:18; 2 Corinthians 4:17)?
