In John 15, Jesus prescribes this good kind of desperation for his disciples. 	
I. Spiritual Begins Only in Jesus A. Jesus uses the imagery of a vine to describe spiritual life.	
B. The people of Israel were frequently described as a vine or vineyard in the Old Testament 5:1-7; Jeremiah 2:21; Psalm 80).	(Isaiah
C. When Jesus says, "I am the true vine," he is making a profound claim.1. Where the people of Israel failed to rightly obey and represent God, he perfectly obeys and reveals the character and purpose of God.
