- B. No one enjoys being lied to. We know that lying is inconsiderate and can be very hurtful.
- C. The issue goes deeper, to the nature of God and our calling (Heb 6:17-18; John 17:17; Rom 12:2).

Of seven things mentioned that the LORD, two revolve around lying (<i>Prov 6:16-19</i>); 1. Lies create delusions, leading people astray (<i>Jer 23:32</i>). 2. Lies destroy the innocent and pervert justice (<i>Prov 14:25</i>). 3. The poor are ruined with lying words (<i>Isa 32:7</i>). 4. Lies undermine morality and create a separation from God (<i>Rom 1:24-25</i>). The first sins in recorded history immediately led to a lack of authenticity (<i>Gen 3:8-10; 4:8-9</i>). The first recorded sin among Christians was lying (<i>Acts 5:1-11</i>). The fate of liars is clearly described throughout the Bible (<i>Prov 19:5; Rev 21:8</i>).
