Who Am I to Answer Back to God?

(Romans 9)

Scripture Reading: 1 Peter 2:1-8

- A. Jesus the Christ is a living stone in the pathway of every human being.
 - 1. Some will build and base every aspect of life on him as a foundation.
 - 2. Some will reject him and stumble over him to their own destruction.
- B. You have done, you are doing, and you will do something in relation to this stone.
- I. Paul's great concern and continued love for his fellow Jews (Romans 9:1-5)
 - A. The great sorrow and unceasing anguish he feels in his heart (9:1-3)
 - B. The tragedy of wasted potential (9:4-5)
- II. Two examples of the "purpose of election" at work (*Romans 9:6-13*)
 - A. Example #1: Abraham had two sons Ishmael (from Hagar) and Isaac (from Sarah)
 - 1. There is more to being a child of God than the product of a certain fleshly family tree!
 - 2. Isaac was more than Abraham's physical child; he was a child of promise.
 - B. Example #2: Isaac had two sons with Rebekah Jacob and Esau.
 - 1. Even before they were born, God told Rebekah, "The older will serve the younger."
 - 2. Why? "In order that God's purpose of election might continue."
 - 3. More than the individual brothers, two nations are being referenced.
- III. The "purpose of election" is justified (Romans 9:14-33)
 - A. Illustrated by Moses and Pharaoh (9:14-18)
 - B. Remember what we read in Romans 2:6-11.
 - 1. God does not harden humble, receptive, righteous people.
 - 2. The person God hardens is the one who has personally chosen to reject God.
 - 3. But God will be glorified by both!
 - C. The potter and the clay (9:19-29)
 - D. How does this impact the Gentiles? (9:30) How does this impact the Jews? (9:31-33)
 - E. What, then, will **YOU** do with Jesus?
