## If You Progress, God Will Perfect

Scripture Reading: Philippians 3:12-16

- A. "You therefore must be **perfect**, as your heavenly Father is **perfect**" (Matthew 5:48).
- B. "But I'll never measure up!" "That's an impossible standard!" "I'll never be good enough!"
- C. What does the Bible say about this issue? It speaks to the **past**, the **present**, and the **future**.

## I. The PAST — What Jesus HAS DONE

- A. Our universal problem (*Romans* 3:23)
  - 1. New Testament commentary on the Old Law of Moses
    - a. *Hebrews 7:11-19* the law made nothing perfect
    - b. Galatians 3:21 the law could not give life
    - c. Hebrews 10:1 the law could not perfect those who draw near
  - 2. And so what are we to do? Is the answer simply more and different rules?
    - a. Don't misunderstand there is a new law, and it is important (1 Corinthians 9:21)!
    - b. But God has done more than throw more laws at our lawlessness (1 John 3:4).
- B. The law and the sacrifices were designed to lead us to Christ (*Galatians 3:24*).
  - 1. What did Jesus' sacrifice accomplish?
    - a. "He has **perfected** for all time those who are being sanctified" (Hebrews 10:14).
    - b. "You have come...to the spirits of the righteous made **perfect**" (Hebrews 12:22-24).
  - 2. Does this mean we are forever perfected, with no personal obligations whatsoever?
    - a. Romans 6:1-4 speaks directly against such a conclusion.
    - b. "He has perfected for all time those who are being sanctified" (Hebrews 10:14).

## II. The PRESENT — What God IS DOING

- A. While Jesus' sacrifice has perfected, in another sense, God is actively working to perfect.
- B. We are not on our own in this trek to perfection!
  - 1. Romans 16:25 "Now to him who is able to strengthen you according to my gospel"
  - 2. Ephesians 3:14-19 "he may grant you to be strengthened with power"
  - 3. 1 Thessalonians 5:23 "may the God of peace himself sanctify you completely"
  - 4. 2 Thessalonians 3:3 "he will establish you and guard you against the evil one"
  - 5. 1 Peter 5:10 "the God of all grace...will restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish"
  - 6. Jude 24-25 "Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling"

## III. The FUTURE — What we MUST CONTINUE TO DO

- A. How did Paul reason in light of this glorious gospel? (*Philippians 2:12-13*)
- B. What should we be doing? (2 Peter 1:3-11)
- C. Paul wasn't perfect (*Philippians 3:12*), but his death could still be gain (*Philippians 1:21-23*).
