When Jesus Says, "Woe to You!"

Scripture Reading: Matthew 22:41-46

Introduction:

- A. Seven times in *Matthew 23* Jesus pronounces "woe" on the scribes and Pharisees of his day.
- B. "Woe" is grievous distress, affliction, or trouble. It is an exclamation of grief or lamentation.
- C. Using Matthew 23 as a type of mirror for self-examination, Jesus will say "woe" to me...

I. If I preach, but do not (23:3).
II. If I expect more of than I am willing to do (23:4).
III. If I do all my deeds to be by others (23:5).
IV. If I myself (23:5-12).
V. If I serve as a at the entrance of the kingdom of heaven (23:13-15).
VI. If I am blinded by human and worldly (23:16-22).
VII. If I neglect the matters of God's expectations (23:23-24).
VIII. If I am and on the inside (23:25-28).
IX. If I am confronted with and refuse to respond (23:29-36).

Conclusion:

- A. The "good news" of Jesus Christ is that it is not too late! (Matthew 23:37-39)
- B. For those who are willing to respond to God's grace, the opportunity stands (1 Peter 3:18-22).
