

# What Repentance Looks Like

- A. In Acts 20:26-27 Paul described his efforts to proclaim “*the whole counsel of God.*” What is that?
- B. We have not heard “*the whole counsel of God*” if we have not heard his command to \_\_\_\_\_  
(Ezek 18:30; Matt 3:2; Mark 1:15; Acts 2:38; 8:22; 17:30).
- C. There is more to following Jesus than repentance, but certainly not less (Luke 13:5).
- D. Repentance is hard—harder than regret, embarrassment, or the offering of an apology.

- \_\_\_\_\_ over sin (Psa 51:17; 2 Cor 7:8-9)
- \_\_\_\_\_ of sin (Psa 32:5; 2 Cor 7:11)
- \_\_\_\_\_ of sin (Ezra 9:6; Psa 32:6-7; 2 Cor 7:11)
- \_\_\_\_\_ of sin - (Psa 32:8-9; Ezek 14:6; 2 Cor 7:11)
- \_\_\_\_\_ from sin (Psa 32:10-11; 2 Cor 7:10)

*“Blessed is the man whose transgression is **forgiven**, whose sin is **covered**.” (Psa 32:1)*

*“Or do you presume on the riches of his **kindness** and **forbearance** and **patience**, not knowing that God’s kindness is meant to **lead you to repentance**?” (Rom 2:4)*
