It is an amazing thing that God calls us to do and be. - Staying true to God through trials, difficulties and distractions
(Job 19:25-26, 2:3; Heb. 4:12-13; 1 Thess.2:5,10)

◆ Daniel (Dan. 6:4-5)

- The ever-present example of standing firm in an hostile nation
(Dan. 1:8, 6:10; Eph.4:1, 1:4)

◆ Enoch (Gen. 5:21-24)

- A short story that speaks volumes
(James 1:4; Col.1:10; Eph.5:15; 1 Thess.2:12)

◆ Elijah (2 Kings 2:11-12)

- Relentless standing for righteousness among God’s enemies
(Phil.2:12-16; 1 Kings 17-18, 19:1-3, 14-18, 2 Kings 1)
