Why My Family Needs the Bible

"...from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures..." (2 Timothy 3:15).

<u>Introduction</u>: What is the best way we can help our community? There may be many ways to help. Yet, I believe the best way is by getting families in the community back to the Bible. Please consider seven reasons why my family, our community and our world needs the Bible.

I. The Bible Tells Of Our Origins

- A. At some point in life, my children are going to ask three big questions.
 - 1. Where did I come from?
 - 2. Why am I here?
 - 3. Where am I going?
- B. God's Word enables me to answer questions I cannot naturally know—such as origins (1 Corinthians 2:11-15; Genesis 1:1; Romans 1:18).
 - 1. The book of Genesis helps us learn much about our origins (Genesis 1:1).
 - 2. The explanation in Genesis is consistent with logic.
 - i. Design demands a designer.
 - ii. Creation demands a Creator (Romans 1:18).
- C. The Bible provides God's revelation to the question of origins. Without it, we are merely freaks of nature coincidentally coming to life by random chance.

II. The Bible Teaches About Hope.

- A. We not only want to know where we came from, but what happens after death.
- B. We are left with the option of two contrasting philosophies.
 - 1. Death is a final end (1 Corinthians 15:32).
 - 2. Death can be met with confidence (1 Thessalonians 4:13-18; Hebrews 6:19-20; 1 Peter 3:15).
- C. The historical fact of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ is the source of hope.

III. The Bible Gives Us Purpose

- A. Generally, people do not invent or create things without a purpose.
- B. Likewise, God the Creator reveals to us His purpose through His Word (Colossians 1:16; cp. Romans 3:23; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20).
- C. My family needs the Bible because we need to know we are special and we have a purpose in this life!

IV. The Bible Is A Family Compass

- A. Families need to know their family roles (Genesis 2:18-25; Matthew 19:4-6; Colossians 3:18-21).
- B. Families need a compass when it comes to their morals/values.
 - 1. It is a common fallacy to think we know what is best for us (Proverbs 14:12).
 - 2. Yet, morals are determined by God's revealed will (2 Peter 1:3; Gal 5:19-21).
- C. Families need to learn how to chisel character (2 Timothy 1:5; 3:15; 1 Cor 10:11).

V. The Bible Is A Source for Evidence

- A. It is no coincidence young people are leaving the church behind as so many churches have left the Scriptures behind in their teaching.
- B. The Bible should be used to provide evidence for faith (John 20:30-31; Luke 24:48; Acts 1:8; 2 Peter 1:16).

VI. The Bible Teaches A Proper Perspective on Life

- A. What is true success?
- B. The world may see such goals as praiseworthy, but God has a different perspective (1 John 2:15-17).

VII. The Bible Teaches God's Plan of Salvation

- A. Though the Bible was written by forty different authors over 1500 years, it still covers one continuous theme—the scheme of redemption (Genesis 2-3; Rev 22:1-3).
- B. The simple story of mankind is...
 - 1. Man has committed sin and deserves death (Isaiah 59:1-2; Romans 6:23).
 - 2. Jesus paid the penalty for our sins (Matthew 20:28; Heb 9:26).
 - 3. Through obedience to Jesus Christ, man can have the "forgiveness of sins" (John 14:6; Acts 2:36-39; Romans 6:3-6).
- C. As we try to help our families in so many ways, are we missing out on the eternal help God offers to give us through His Son?
