## 3—Nebuchadnezzar's Dream About the Coming Kingdom Daniel 2

- 1. King Nebuchadnezzar had a troubling dream and wanted an explanation. What wise rules did he lay down for those who would interpret his dream (2:1-13)? What was the punishment for failure (2:5)? What was the reward (2:6)?
- 2. Just like ancient Babylon, there are many modern-day astrologers, diviners and soothsayers. How can we "test the spirits" to expose some of their occult practices (cp. 1 John 4:1)?
- 3. What was the response of Daniel and his friends when they found out their lives were in danger (Daniel 2:14-24)? What lesson can we learn about how we ought to respond in pressing circumstances (cp. James 5:13; Philippians 4:6-7)?
- 4. As Daniel interprets, who gets the credit for revealing the dream (Daniel 2:25-30)? What does this reveal about his heart? What does Proverbs 15:33 say comes before "honor?"



- 5. Daniel revealed the dream in Daniel 2:31—
- 35. What did the various materials of the image represent (Daniel 2:39-40)? Summarize the dream and its interpretation (2:36-45).

6. What did the stone "cut out without hands" do (Daniel 2:34)? What became of that stone (2:35)? What unusual action of God is prophesied as occurring in the days of that fourth kingdom (Daniel 2:44)?
7. According to Luke 2:1 and 3:1 which empire was in power in the days of Jesus? How can Mark 1:14-15; Luke 3:1 and Matthew 3:1-2 help us realize the fulfillment of this prophecy?
8. How did the king react to Daniel's statements (Daniel 2:46-47)? What happened to Daniel after the dream and its interpretation were made known (Daniel 2:48-49)?
9. What does Hebrews 1:1 say about how God formerly communicated? How did he communicate this message to Daniel (2:19)? How does God reveal Himself to us "in these last days" (Hebrews 1:2)?
