В.	Proof (noun): Evidence sufficient to establish a thing as true, or to produce belief in its truth. Many struggle with a serious mental obstacle: "I'm just not sure God is willing to save me." As an authoritative answer, consider three episodes in the lives of three examples from the Bible.
Ex	hibit #1 —: "He Struck Down the Egyptian and Hid Him in the Sand" (<i>Exo 2:11-15</i>)

	C. He "supposed that his brothers would understand," but he was wrong (Exo 2:13-14; Acts 7:25).

Ex	hibit #2 —: "Set Uriah in the forefrontthat he may be struck down" (2 Sam 11)
	A. He was an established king, soldier, and poet at this point in his life (2 Sam 11:1).
	B. He demonstrated an awareness of the seriousness of his actions (2 Sam 11:2-13).
	C. He supposed that he could hide his sin, but he was wrong (2 Sam 11:14-12:7).
	D. The ripple effect of his actions affected his family for generations to come (2 Sam 12:8-14).
Ex	hibit #3 —: "Ravaging the Church" (<i>Act</i> s <i>7:54-8:3</i>)
	A. He was "a young man" at this point in his life (Acts 7:58), with an elite education (22:3).
	B. He demonstrated an awareness of the seriousness of his actions (Acts 22:4-5).
	C. He wrongly believed that he was in harmony with God's will (Acts 26:9-11; 1 Tim 1:13).
	D. As long as he lived, he never forgot his "former life" (<i>Gal 1:13; 1 Tim 1:15</i>).
