GRACE: What? Why? Where?

Introduction: A. "Grace to you" (Eph 1:1-10).
B. What is your soul's greatest need? and (John 1:14). C. The aim of God's book is to inform and invite me to appreciate and respond to God's grace.
I. GRACE: WHAT is it? A. That which gives, pleasure or delight (the most basic idea behind the Greek word <i>charis</i>). Used in the New Testament in this context in reference to speech (<i>Luke 4:22; Col 4:6; Eph 4:29</i>).
B. Good-will, lovingkindness, Used of God toward people that is unmerited (<i>Eph 2:4-9</i>).
C. A spiritual state or in which I am enjoying God's favor (Rom 5:1-2; 1 Pet 5:12).
D. An expression of for the undeserved favor of God (1 Tim 1:12).
E. This cycle is exactly what we first read in <i>Ephesians 1:3-10</i> .
II. GRACE: WHY do I need it? A. Because of the truth contained in <i>Romans 5:8</i> — I'm a
B. Because I'm a sinner "without" (Rom 1:20).
III. GRACE: WHERE can I find it? A. "But God" (Eph 2:4-7). God is the giver (Eph 2:8), we are the receivers (2 Cor 6:1). B. What must we do to receive God's gracious gift? 1 our sin, our alienation from God and the consequences (Acts 2:37).

3. Titus 3:4-7 speaks of (John 3:5; Acts 2:38-41).
