Under Construction in 2009 Building a Work Crew

Scripture Reading: Psalm 48

Introduction:

- A. Nehemiah faced a **great challenge** and had **great faith** in a **great God**, but he would have accomplished very little had there not been **great dedication** on the part of the people who helped him rebuild the wall.
- B. When it comes to the work of the Lord, there is no place for spectators or self-appointed advisors and critics; but there is always room for workers.

I. The purpose of the work

- A. Nehemiah 2:17 "that we may no longer suffer derision..."
- B. The purpose of all serving is the glory of God (1 Corinthians 10:31; 2 Corinthians 4:5)

II. The pattern of the work

- A. Thirty-eight individual workers are named in *Nehemiah 3*, and forty-two different groups are identified. Each worker was assigned a place and a task.
- B. In 1 Corinthians 12 and 14, Paul compared each individual Christian to members of a body.

III. The people in the work

- A. There were three attitudes toward the construction:
 - 1. Some were busy in the work
 - 2. Some let others do the work
 - 3. Some flat-out opposed the work
- B. God uses all kinds of people.
 - 1. Different backgrounds...
 - 2. Different projects...
 - 3. Different roles to fill...
 - 4. ...but He expects that we have one mind to work!
