 Paul, Peter

 Overcoming the adversities of daily life through faith in God

1940 - 1960

- "Which mortal person in all the history of mankind is the greatest?"
 Leaders of World War II: Presidents, Generals, Medal of Honor recipients

Beginning to shift from a display of strong personal values to "success" as the standard

1960 - 1980

- "Which mortal person in all the history of mankind is the greatest?" Entertainers: Elvis and the Beatles Sports stars: Namath, Palmer, Chamberlain, Spitz Political leaders

 "Professional results," personal talents, accumulated wealth

1980 - 2000

 - A. Those who are in the kingdom of heaven (*Matthew 11:1-11*)
 - B. Those who are in the kingdom of heaven are "great" because:
 - 1. A greater covenant (*Hebrews 8:1-6*)
 - 2. Better promises (2 Peter 1:2-4)
 - 3. A better High Priest (Hebrews 7:23-28; 1 John 4:1-4; Philippians 4:13)
 - 4. A higher calling taking on the likeness of Christ and allowing the world to see Christ in me (1 Peter 2:21-25)
 - C. The poor widow as an example (*Luke 21:1-4*)
 - D. The saving of a country is an amazing feat, but the saving of a soul is even greater (*Matthew 4:8-9; Luke 19:10; 15:7,10*)
