Trusting God When The Food Runs Out

Elijah: A Man of Heroism and Humility

Scripture Reading: James 5:13-18

- A. In our last study, we compared 1 Kings 17:2-7 to a type of "boot camp" experience.
 - 1. When boot camp ends, advanced training follows—more demanding, complicated, rugged.
 - 2. The goal? To be prepared for *real* battle.
- B. We are using that figure because it is a dramatic analogy of what Elijah encountered during the next stage of his training as a fully devoted and completely equipped man of God.
- I. "Arise, go to Zarephath, which belongs to Sidon, and dwell there" (1 Kings 17:9)
 - A. Zarephath from a Hebrew verb that means "to melt." In noun form, "a crucible."
 - B. Spiritual crucibles have unique potential to create pure godliness.
 - 1. *Malachi 3:1-3*—in reference to the coming of the Messiah.
 - 2. "How do you know when the silver is fully refined?" "When I see my reflection in it."

II. God's plan for Elijah in Zarephath

- A. God knew where Elijah was (17:8)
- B. God knew where Elijah was going (17:8-9)
- C. God knew, and God had prepared (17:9)

III. Elijah's tests while in Zarephath

- A. "So he arose and went to Zarephath..." (17:10-11)
- B. Welcome to Zarephath, Elijah! (17:12)
- C. Elijah saw beyond the difficulty and handled the problem with faith, not fear (17:13-14)
- D. Man's informed obedience + God's wise and faithful provision = great things (17:15-16)
