I. "After many days..." — Elijah's second confrontation with King Ahab (1 Kings 18:1-18)

- A. Three years earlier, God had told Elijah, "Go, hide yourself" (18:3)
- B. Elijah was the most wanted man in the land.
- C. Ahab: "Is it you, you troubler of Israel?" (18:17)
- D. Elijah shifts the blame for the severe desolation back where it belongs (18:18)
- E. The showdown begins: Ahab vs. Elijah; or more accurately, idolatry vs. the living God.

II. "Therefore send and gather all Israel to me at Mount Carmel..." (1 Kings 18:19-40)

- A. Elijah aims to provide undeniable proof that the LORD is the one true God (18:21-24).
 - 1. Baal was worshiped as the god of the sun (the "fire of the universe").
 - 2. Elijah's plan will provide a reasonable test of the power of the rival deities.
- B. "But there was no voice; no one answered; no one paid attention" (18:25-29).
- C. "The God who answers by fire, the LORD, he is God" (18:30-40).
